From the onset of this pandemic, NKSS students have been encouraged to <u>commit to participating</u> in (a minimum of) 2 hours of learning time per class <u>each</u> week.

In order to help students achieve this "minimum" they must continue to choose from (<u>one or both</u>) of the following <u>three options</u> for modified learning. Again, these activities have been designed as a response to the current situation. They are in place to support and facilitate student learning at this time.

OPTION #1

Video and Research Learning Activities

Weekly assignments, and videos with response sheets help students to be able to identify Materials, Processes, Tools and Machines commonly used in Woodworking.

OPTION #2

Projects @Home Activities

Students (safely) engage in a variety of Woodwork related projects at home and provide detailed records of their learning as it relates to the Materials, Processes, Tools and Machines used in their projects.

OPTION #3

Combination of the above (OPTIONS #1-#2)

Students may choose this option to help them fulfil the minimum learning time of 2 hrs per week.

ASSESSMENT

Participation and completion marks are assigned as students submit their activities in a timely, thorough and thoughtful manner.
